- Writing Sample: AI Adoption by Rural SMEs: Exploring Current Trends

Spotlight (2000 - 2500 words)

- Writing Sample: Charting Paths to Decolonise Economic Geography

2. Authors work with the section editor to develop their articles to an agreed deadline.
3. The authors and editors approve the final version of the article.
4. The article is published in the issue and made available to readers.
5. *Regions* ezine does not have an impact factor, but a DOI will be assigned to the published article a maximum of 15 days after publication.
